

Western Wall Note

As you know, the Western Wall is an important site in Judaism. Assume that you are a devout Jew and have made a long and somewhat strenuous pilgrimage to this site and want to place an appropriate prayer / note in the cracks of this hallowed place.

- Letter is contemporary (writing as a Jew today)
- Pick one of the sects/ branches of Judaism taught in the initial unit lesson (i.e. Orthodox, Reformed, Reconstructionist, Conservative, etc.) and write the note from that perspective
- Letters will be typed
- Roughly one page, double spaced

Assessment:

T – Overall creativity within the text

A – Incorporation of key terms and learning within the text – using the lexicon, your portfolio write-up, and /or additional research

C – spelling, grammar, punctuation, overall structure, etc.
